The bustling piers of Ogden Point came alive on Oct 5 as Defence on the Dock returned to Victoria for its fourth iteration.

A highly anticipated biennial showcase, Defence on the Dock offered members of the public with a rare opportunity to experience the operations and equipment that make up the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) and Royal Canadian Navy (RCN). This year's event featured interactive exhibits, large-scale displays, tours, and hands-on demonstrations spread across themed zones throughout the pier.

Approximately 8,000 attendees explored the heart of Canada's maritime Defence community at the event. Docked at the centre of the excitement was His Majesty's Canadian Ship (HMCS) Vancouver and His Majesty's Canadian Submarine Corner Brook, both offering guided tours to attendees. Vancouver welcomed approximately 2,000 visitors aboard its decks, while Corner Brook provided an inside look at life under the sea with tours of its tight quarters and the specialized equipment of the Canadian Submarine Force (CANSUBFOR).

For those who preferred action on the waves, rigid-hulled inflatable boat (RHIB) rides gave over 200 attendees the thrill of speeding across the Victoria harbour.

To Matt Carlson, Base Public Affairs Projects Officer, the event was incredibly fulfilling.

"I'm incredibly proud of our team and stakeholders as it truly was such a special event," said Carlson. "We learned a lot, and we're already looking forward to making 2027 even bigger and better."

The day's programming extended well beyond the fleet, with different zones scattered across the pier highlighting CAF talent, roles, and partnerships. A new Sports Zone featured 10 organizations promoting active living and community engagement, including popular SPINCO bike ride classes that drew approximately 100 participants. Other zones included an Entertainment Zone with live performances by the Naden Band of the RCN, a Big Vehicle Zone featuring heavy logistics equipment, and more. The Marine Career Expo also shared insight into a wide range of CAF and RCN trades, careers, and training opportunities.

The event was also attended by Canadian provincial ministers and MLAs who met with CAF leader-

ship, in addition to a media tour. The Esquimalt Military and Family Resource Centre (EMFRC) also provided attendees with a variety of delicious food options.

As such, Defence on the Dock continues to grow in popularity as it offers Canadians fresh perspectives from which to explore our nation's Defence community. With strong attendance and smiles throughout the day, the event once again proved that the connection between Vancouver Island, the RCN, and CAF is as strong as ever.

A small but determined team from the Department of National Defence (DND) recently travelled to one of Canada's most remote Arctic outposts to reactivate a facility long asleep under the snow.

The mission began in July, when Barge Master Scott Kimmett of the Port Operations and Emergency Services Branch (POESB) joined DND colleagues from across the nation at the Nanisivik Naval Fueling Facility for a nine-day operation, the first of its kind. The mission continued into the fall with a second, two-week trip North to the facility in late September.

Their goal? To de-winterize, reactivate, and consolidate stored diesel at the site, preparing the recovered fuel for donation to the Government of Nunavut.

Located on the grounds of a former lead-zinc mine, the Nanisivik naval facility is found on the northern end of Baffin Island, Nunavut, both a remote and strategically significant part of Canada. Before the team could begin operations, nearly 8,000 pounds of equipment were airlifted from Iqaluit to Arctic Bay, where it was then trucked across the tundra to the isolated site.

"Upon arrival, we found the base fully winterized," said Kimmett. "With no team members having prior experience at the site and limited procedural documentation available, much of our efforts involved tracing systems, removing blanked piping, and reinstalling components."

Following the reinstallation, the team then

tackled an extensive troubleshooting phase to program the facility's systems and clear active faults. Working in a remote location without internet access or cellular connectivity, challenges were compounded without access to technical resources in real time.

"Many of our tasks demanded improvised solutions beyond the plant's original design," noted

Despite its challenges, the team successfully completed the operation by consolidating the facility's remaining diesel fuel at just a fraction of the cost originally quoted by civilian contractors. Furthermore, utilizing DND expertise for the operation proved both efficient and invaluable for the facility's future.

"The deployment provided hands-on experience to our team, who are now familiar with the processes required to winterize, reactivate, and operate the plant — knowledge that will streamline future operations," said Kimmet.

Daily life during the operation was equally demanding as technical work. With the base's accommodations shut down, the team stayed in a hotel at Arctic Bay and commuted to the site daily under the watchful eye of a bear monitor, an armed local hired to protect the crew from polar bears and other dangerous mammals. Realities were also underscored when weather delays and mechanical issues left the team stranded in Iqaluit for several days during their return trip.

During the trip in September the defueling process was completed with approximately 500,000 liters of fuel successfully defueled to the oil/chemical bulk carrier ship KITIKMEOT, which will then disperse the fuel to local Arctic communities."

After nearly three decades of dedicated service on the West Coast, His Majesty's Canadian Ship (HMCS) *Nanaimo* officially departed Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Esquimalt on Oct 6 for reassignment to CFB Halifax.

First commissioned on May 10, 1997, HMCS *Nanaimo* was the first

Kingston-class Maritime Coastal Defence Vessel (MCDV) to serve from the West Coast. In addition to participating in international deployments and operations, *Nanaimo* has also provided support to the

Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), the Canadian Coast Guard (CCG), and Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). The vessel has also served as a training platform for junior officers and participated in environmental disaster response and search and rescue operations.

Canada under its motto of 'Faith and Labour.'





IDENTIFYING HEALTHY VS. UNHEALTHY ONLINE RELATIONSHIP BEHAVIOURS

The table below highlights healthy and unhealthy behaviours in online relationships. It's essential to feel safe saying 'no' and to communicate openly about boundaries. Remember: once something is sent online, you may not be able to control where it ends up.

HEALTHY BEHAVIOURS	UNHEALTHY BEHAVIOURS
Setting expectations for when you'll be in touch and allowing time to disconnect.	Pressuring someone to always be available online, repeatedly messaging or calling.
Sharing messages or images only with permission.	Posting online or sharing without consent.
Openly discussing when something online makes you uncomfortable.	Belittling or refusing to hear your concerns.
Acknowledging power dynamics and respecting boundaries.	Using military rank or status to pressure someone into doing something they're uncomfortable with.
Encouraging each other's independence and self-care.	Constantly asking for explanations about your whereabouts.
Discussing expectations around intimate messages or images.	Pressuring someone into intimate conversations or sending images without consent.
Taking steps to protect your privacy, such as avoiding photos with identifiable features (face, tattoos, name, location, military unit).	Sharing or threatening to share intimate images or messages.
Recognizing when it's appropriate to discuss and share financial information as trust develops.	Asking for your banking details or personal financial information when it doesn't make sense.

DND Employee Saves Rare Yellow-Billed Loon in B.C.

While travelling through smoky conditions in Manning Park, British Columbia (B.C.) on Sept 9, Department of National Defence (DND) employee Lorraine Crinkley encountered a rare sight on the highway — a yellow-billed loon.

Believing the bird to be dead at first glance, Crinkley turned back after spotting movement as her vehicle passed. Scooping it up off the highway, Crinkley then wrapped the loon in a towel and held the bird in her own lap until they reached phone service, where it was arranged to take the bird to the nearest wildlife hospital.

Yellow-billed loons (gavia adamsii) are among Canada's rarest breeding birds. With a global population of only 16,000 that has declined by over 50 per cent over the past 50 years, the yellow-billed loon is both the rarest species of loon and endangered.

Exhausted, dehydrated, and disoriented upon its arrival (likely from the smoke of wildfires in the region), the loon was safely released from the hospital the next morning into a large body of water near Manning Park.

Because loons' legs are positioned far back on their bodies, they are unable to walk or take flight from land, requiring water to propel themselves into the air. Confused by reflective surfaces, they sometimes mistake roads for lakes, which is likely how Crinkley's loon made its way to the middle of a B.C. highway.

Crinkley, who has worked for DND for over seven years and assisted with over 20 wildlife rescues, said this was the first bird she had ever seen survive.

"At first I was surprised, and then happy. It was a little emotional because I get invested and really take these moments to heart," said Crinkley. "It was the best part of my time off."
